

Notes from the Health Office

Immunizations

By state law, we are required to have a complete immunization card on each of our students. Please see the included Immunization Requirements. If you have received a call from Susan Groeger, our Health Technician, regarding your child's immunization status, please ensure that your child receives those immunizations and that the school has documentation of them.

Health Care Concerns

In order to provide the best possible care of your child while in school, we try to maintain current health information. Please fill out the enclosed form to assist us. If your child has a health care concern that you would like the Health Office to be aware of, please come in and speak to our Health Technician about it. We would like to know ways that we can help your child have a positive and healthy school experience. We may ask you to fill out a Health Care Action Plan to help address any significant health concerns.

Food Allergies

We have some students at Liberty Common High School with significant (potentially fatal) food allergies, especially to peanuts and other nuts. In some cases, even the fumes from these foods can trigger a reaction. In order to provide a safe environment for these students, we are asking that snacks including peanuts and peanut butter not be brought into the classroom.

Medications

If your child will need any medication while at school, the medication must be stored in the Health Office. Additionally, there are release forms that need to be completed by the parent and physician. This includes any over-the-counter medications, such as Tylenol, Ibuprofen and cough drops. Students should not bring any medications to school to be taken without supervision.
